THE W.E.A

I am sometimes asked 'What is the WEA'?
Does the 'W' stand for 'Women' as in W.I?
The Workers Educational Association, to give it its correct title, was founded in 1903. It was recognised as a 'Responsible Body' in 1924 while the first record of a Branch in East Bridgford was in 1975. From the outset, the W.E.A has organised courses in what are traditionally known as the "Liberal Studies"; history, literature and the arts, philosophy, politics, social studies and the non-technological aspects of the sciences. The courses are not directed towards qualifications or specific career skills. There is no upper age limit, there are no entry requirements and many courses assume little or no previous knowledge of the subject being studied.

The programme of courses in this area is organised by The University of Nottingham, Department of Adult Education, in partnership with the W.E.A and each year a free booklet, giving complete details of the courses held both at the W.E.A Headquarters at 16, Shakespeare Street, Nottingham and in surrounding villages, is available from your local branch or from W.E.A Headquarters.

In East Bridgford the Wednesday morning meeting by tradition has an historical bias ranging from 'Aspects of Ancient Egypt' to 'Village Life in the Middle Ages'. The subjects on other mornings and evenings cover Art, Music and Gardening to mention but a few. i.e Something for everyone, so if you have not been before, come along and meet friends old and new. You will be assured of a warm welcome.

HIMALAYAN JOURNEY/CLIMB

The tent shook violently. My tiny one man blister shaped rag hut was coping well with the high altitude Himalavan wind. More so than I. I'd just opened my eyes to emerge from only semiconsciousness after an awful night of intense cold, headache and nausea. It's 4am and time to move. Today is the day I must attempt the climb to the summit of Imja Tse at 20,305ft. It is important I do so because my return to Kathmandu is imminent to ensure I catch my flight back to India, and than on home to East Bridgford. I was forewarned in no uncertain terms that if I failed to be on time I could be stuck here for weeks to come.

I lay in total darkness, devoid of all enthusiasm to emerge from my sleeping bag. I am already cold despite the fact I am fully clothed, including down jacket, and my thick woollen dachestein gloves on my feet. Groping and fumbling around in the inky blackness, my hand grasps the head torch to reveal the chaos of gear piled up around me in my tiny mobile but.


Despite the fact I feel dreadfully sick, I must eat and force as much liquid down me as possible to counter the effects of altitude dehydration. Fortunately I had the foresight to pour the water that I had laboriously collected from a trickle on the nearby glacier, (a one hour round trip mind you) the previous afternoon, into the billy can. I now had a solid block of ice, albeit in the right container, with which to make porridge and drink. And a disgusting affair it was too, a glutinous mass washed down with semi warm tea, with a hint of tincture of iodine.

By the timne I had rigged myself up in harness and all the paraphanalia associated with climbing mountains, hoisted rucksack onto my back, I felt pretty damned exhausted, hardly able to walk, let alone climb.

But I knew my body would rally round for the assault.

I was ready.

This vivid account by climber Chris Comerie refers to a dramatic episode during his trek from Kathmandu to the base camp of Everest which he undertook last year. Chris has been involved in outdoor pursuits for over 25 years. He is an experienced potholer and rock climber as well as mountaineer and it is in the latter capacity that he will be accomanying the British Mount Everest Medical Expedition in 1994. Chris is a builder by occupation who lives in the village and he will be talking about his Himalayan experiences and the forthcoming expedition at the VILLAGE HALL ON FRIDAY 29TH JANUARY at 7.30pm. CIARA HENNESSY PROGRESS REPORT

We have again attended the British Institute for Brain Injured Children at Bridgwater for reassessment with Ciara and we are very pleased to report here their findings.

She is now beginning to see detail and to understand some words, she is generally more aware and has more idea of forward movement. She has more controlled leg movement, is more vocal and has better head control and muscle tone.

The circumferance of her head has increased by 2.2cm which is 140% more than would be expected in an average child. This we are very pleased about as it would seem that her skull has grown to accommodate extra growth to brain cells which have been stimulated on her programme. We continue to be very grateful to all our helpers and look forward to more improvement in the next three months when we will return to B.I.B.I.C once more. They have asked us to increase her programmes by five more a week and we are asking our helpers if they can spare extra time so that this can be achieved.

EAST BRIDGFORD HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY

The W.I.Hut was the venue on Friday 13th November for an illustrated talk by John Gregory, Nat.Dip.Hort (RHS) of Mill Hill House Nurseries, Elston entitled "Flower Power Plus", about 50 members being present.

Introduced by the President, Mr Terry Bradley, Mr Gregory took us through the gardening year telling us about bulbs, hebaceous plants and shrubs, common and not so common, which will give colour throughout the year.

Two early spring bulbs worth considering were the chrysanthus species of dwarf crocus and the species Tris "Katherine Hodgkin", only 5 inches tall and flowering in March, bulbs of this being scarce and expensive.

The willow Salix hastata Wehrhahnii really caught my eye, having deep purple stems that contrast with the silver-gray catkins which appear in April before the leaves. This is a compact shrub only 4-5ft tall.

For the smaller garden, Mr Gregory recommended <u>Deutzia elegantissima</u> "Rosealind" which is a deciduous bushy shrub with a height and spread of 4-5ft producing clusters of deep pink flowers in May and June. However, you must prune every flowering shoot immediately after flowering.

Poppies come in many vibrant colours while for a dry situation the hardy cranesbill geraniums cannot be bettered. (Mr Gregory has many different varieties for sale at his nursery). Again for midsummer colour in a dry and sunny situation, Mr Gregory suggested the Helianthemums (Rock Roses) which come in many sizes and colours, one particularly to note being "Beech Park Red".

One slide which caused a lot of comment was of the grey foliaged Eryngium giganteum "Miss Wilmot's Ghost", a biennial which grows to 3-4ft bearing thistle or teasel-like flowers. contrasted to it in front was the bright orange-red flower of Asclepias tuberosa which although Mr Gregory thought was not frost hardy, is according to the RHS Gardeners' Encyclopedia fully frost hardy. They do however, need a sunny well drained position like a raised bed.

Michaelmas Daisies, or Asters, give autumn colour and the bonus of attraction to butterflies. The frikartii hybrids such as the blue coloured King George are resistant to mildew being characterised by having rough leaves.

As we approached the autumn, Mr Gregory brought to our attention the change in foliage colour of many shrubs, particularly the many Acers (which do not like a windy position) and the many different coloured berries which attract birds into the garden. These include the variegated Stranvaesia davidiana "Pallette" and the many varieties of Cotoneaster and Pyracantha. Of special interest was a slide showing Berberis "Roseglow" and the Euonymus "Emerald Gaiety" being grown together. When the deciduous Berberis loses its leaves, the white edged deep green leaves of the Euonymus still give colour, climbing through the Berberis. After questions, refreshments were followed by the raffle. So ended an enjoyable and instructive evening enhanced by the excellent coloured slides of both Mr Gregory's and other gardens.

DEAD OF NIGHT

The autumn production of the East Bridgford Drama Group was a thriller by Peter Whalley called 'Dead of Night', a two act play with only four members of cast, all of whom were on stage fairly continously for the 15hrs involved.

The play, most ably directed by Kate Thornburrow, is about a man called Jack, played by David Darby, who has just been acquitted of the manslaughter of Phillip Mercer who had broken into his house armed

with a gun and been shot by mistake.

During the play four different accounts are given as to what actually happened. While Jack gave the Court version on which he had been acquitted, one could feel the tension between his neighbours Lynne and Dennis. The latter suspected that his wife had been having an affair with Jack before he was arrested, but stil loving her, was desperately trying to save his marriage.

Dennis, played by Alan Havdock, was basically a decent highly principled man who possibly had hoped that Jack would have been convicted and put in prison. Whatever the reason, he concoted the story that he had hired Phillip Mercer, a former student of his, to kill Jack and which he told in a brilliantly convincing, hesitant manner.

Maggie, Jack's live-in-girlfriend, played by Vicky Rees, clearly portrayed the part of a lover, who not quite sure of where she stood in regard to her

future, preferred to keep her distance.

Lynne, played convincingly by Kim Levis, seemed to live on gin and cigarettes (provided by her 'angel' of a husband) and given the opportunity, was still trying to get off with Jack.

There is little doubt that the star of the evening was David Darby whose change in moods was exactly right and who displayed convincingly the unsavoury character of Jack. His performance was truly a "tour de force".

Minally, the correct answer was the age old story of blackmail as Jack was the 'fence' for Phillip Mercer's robberies. Lynne at the end was shot by mistake for Jack who got his just deserts from Maggie. The audience was kept wondering right until the end what was going to happen and, true to tradition, was unexpected.

ne cannot finish without mentioning the attractive set designed by Geoff Morgan in which

the attention to detail was evident.

This was another production well up to the standard we have come to expect from the East Bridgford Drama Group.

The fine imposed seems to be pretty severe and makes one wonder whether the farmer was very wealthy or that this was not a first offence!! Can anyone equate this fine in 1910 to the present day value of money, more than eighty years later?

"WHO SHALL SEPARATE US FROM THE LOVE OF CHRIST?" (Romans 8:35)

The love of Christ' which St Paul speaks of here is not primarily the love that we should have for Christ, but the love Christ has for us. It is the love for us which Christ showed throughout his life on earth. It is the love he showed when he came to seek us out and shared in our poor, sick and sinful humanity. It is the love he showed when he offered himself on the cross to reconcile us to the Father and obtain for us the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Since Christ is the Son sent by the Father to save us, and He is one with the Father, 'the love of Christ' also means the infinite love which the Father has for the world and for each one of us.

No difficulty no danger can frighten us. No power in the world hinder the plan of salvation Christ and the Father for us.

this can we live this month's Word of Life? We too this, feel the burden of many difficulties, especially some moments. Our difficulties may be material moves, of all kinds, or spiritual ones, deriving from the past or from our weakness. We too may experience mense of anguish and fear when faced with the great minimowns which the future holds for us. We may be appalled by the materialism, violence and immorality which surround we may feel discouraged about the state of society which surrounds us, thinking it impossible to build more just world.

More we have a very real opportunity to live the Word of Life for this month. We must bear witness to our faith in Christ's love for us, which means that Christ with us and the Father's love is with us. Of course, if Christ and the Father are with us, we too must be with them and then indeed anything is possible. For Christians, to be with them means putting into practice femus' words, and particularly the great commandment to love our neighbour.

Love, and especially mutual love, is the fundamental cure for all the ills of our society and of humanity in general. When mutual love is practised on a large scale, there are no more wars, there is no more discrimination, sectarianism or social unrest: there are no more conflicts. With the love of the Father and of Christ, and through our participation in this love, it is possible to transform the world in accordance with God's plan. Peace is possible. Unity between different groups in society and between peoples is We can all live as brothers and sisters. A more honest, healthier and cleaner world is possible. I am sometimes asked what is the greatest day in the Christian Calendar. Much depends on the age of the questioner. Children have no hesitation in nominating Christmas Day, for they have all the excitement of the presents on Christmas morning and they are eager to discover if Santa has brought the gift for which they had hoped. As one grows older, there is the sadness of Good Friday, tinged with the wonder of Jesus' seven words from the Cross and surprised by the triumphant shout of Jesus 'It is finished', a moment or two before he died. This was followed by the hurried taking down of the body, before the evening onset of the Sabbath, and its laying in the tomb by Nicodemus and Joseph of Arimathea, now openly followers of Jesus. accompanied by the Mother of Jesus, Mary Magdalene, and the disciple, whom Jesus loved and who, in his turn, loved Jesus.

VILLAGE REPORT: TRAFFIC

On 22nd February 1993 an open meeting supported by the Parish Council was held in the W.I.Hut to discuss problems of traffic in the village. 97 people attended and made their feelings known.

The main issues were: concern about speed, volume and noise of traffic, cut through traffic, parking, the hazards of walking, cycling and horseriding in the village, and the problems for motorists in getting out of the village in the mornings.

Many imaginative and thoughtful proposals were also made, such as maximum use of existing off street parking places, improving signs, making Trent Lane one way, and, most important, that in improving the traffic situation we could also bring other benefits to the village.

Mr Patterson of the County Highways Department explained that there was no present hope of doing a traffic-taming scheme as East Bridgford roads were 'Category 3' roads and they were only able to do a small number of 'Category 4' roads. However, his department did a survey of road use and found 21% of the traffic was cut-through traffic in the morning.

It is clear from the number of people who attended the meeting and from their comments, that this a very important issue in the village. A number of people were willing to help with a Committee to continue to look at what can be done. We shall hope for the support of the whole village and the help of the Parish Council has already pledged.





THE RECTOR'S PAGES

THE DAY OF PENTECOST

"When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place and suddenly a sound came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind. And it filled the whole house, where they were sitting. And there appeared to them tongues as of fire, distributed and resting on each of them. and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance".

On the first Day of Pentecost (Whit Sunday), the Holy Spirit, whom Jesus had promised, was experienced by his disciples and other followers. Jesus had told them, before his Ascension. to wait. They were not too sure for what they were to wait, but they spent their time patiently praising God with the joy that had been with them, since they had seen the risen Lord; spending long periods in prayer. Then, when they were gathered together, they received the Spirit, experiencing God in wind and fire, with a power as great as the power that had thrown back the stone at Easter. The result was that they went out to use the new gifts they had received to the glory of God.

When we talk about the gifts of the Spirit and the work of the Spirit in the Church today (and there is much talk) we tend to lose sight of the fact that in those first years the main effect of the Spirit was in mission. There were gifts of tongues, inspired sermons, powers of healing, but the Spirit was most obvious in the work of cvangelism. So we find those first disciples receive the first gift of the Spirit, tongues, and use it immediately to inspire belief in others. Mission will always be a fundamental concern of the Church and a Church with no sense of mission has died.

Pentecost is about mission, because that is the first thing that the newly given Spirit inspired the disciples to do. Such was their confidence and conviction that we read in Acts that on the first day of the week about three thousand were converted.

So at Whitsun we pray for the mission of the Church. We pray that church people may be more mission minded. We pray that we may be so filled with the Holy Spirit that we may become the instruments by which God brings others to faith. We must ask ourselves "What am I actually doing to further the mission of the Church in this place"?

THE RECTOR'S PAGES

ANNUAL PAROCHIAL CHURCH MEETING

The Annual Parochial Church Meeting was held in St.Peter's Church on Sunday 25th April following the morning service, when 38 parishioners attended, the Rector taking the chair. Prior to this, the re-election of the Churchwardens and the Deputy Warden took place.

Miss Barbara Mallett reported that there were 145 members on the Electoral Roll, following which Mrs Kim Levis presented the Annual Report on the proceedings of the P.C.C. Mrs Levis, who is retiring from the position of Secretary, was thanked by the Rector for all her hard work.

Mr Geoff Shaw presented, for the first time, the audited accounts and briefly explained and commented on their contents. David Linnington, who retires after being honorary auditor for over ten years, was presented with a framed photograph of St.Peter's Church in recognition of his services. Mr Terry Bradley was unanimously elected in his place.

Mr John Francis gave a lucid report on the state of the fabric, goods and ornaments of the church. Following the Quinquennial Report two years ago, he was able to tell us that all the work required to be carried out on the interior had been completed, while it is hoped that the work still to be carried out on the exterior would be finished this summer. He told us that the Archdeacon of Nottingham had commented very favourably on the excellent state and condition of the Church silver, vestments etc.

Dr Hilary Geisow, Mr Charles Cumberland and Mr Stephen Cumberland were elected to the Deanery Synod. The Rector thanked Mrs Marion Wheeler, who has served on the Synod for the past six years, and who had not sought re-election.

Rosemary Mills and Mr Tony Hawkings were elected to serve on the P.C.C in the place of three retiring members; one vacancy remaining unfilled; and four new sidesman were elected. Mr Charles Cumberland reported on the proceedings of the

Deanery Synod.

There next followed a very thought provoking item entitled'Presentation of the Children's Charter' by Dr Hilary Geisow. Although the word 'Charter' is the in-word these days (Citizen's, patients' etc) Dr Geisow brought most ably and graphically to our attention that 'The Children of this Parish should be equal partners (with adults) in the life of the Church'. She explained the trend away from "Sunday Schools" (with the emphasis on School) to "Clubs" or "Groups". Teenagers no longer liked to be grouped with "children".

The message came over quite clearly from both Wilary Geisow and Michael Clarke that we do not do mough to encourage the younger generation. Following several comments from the "floor", the Rector agreed that this important matter must be followed up and would welcome constructive muggestions. (We will certainly be hearing more about this subject).

Enrlier in the context of the Eucharist, the Nector had presented his Annual Report. He drew attention to the encouragement he has received from the Service of Holy Communion held on the first Wednesday each month at the Manor House attended by both residents, staff and parishioners.

One of the principal initiatives of the past year was the Restoration of St.Peter's Church last Summer, the result of which is there for everyone to see. He particularly wished to thank John Severn the Architect, Bob Large, who acted throughout as an unpaid Clerk of Works, the various contractors who carried out their work with reverence and sensitivity, and the army of voluntary helpers who turned out night after night to clean, polish and beautify our Church building to the greater glory of God.

Finally, the Rector posed the question whether after thirteen good years, should he not make room for someone with more energy, greater vision and less traditional views to lead us into 2,000 A.D? I think his question was answered by Robert Lee, who said that we were in no way looking for a successor and that Alan, ably supported by Joyce and Sally, deserved the grateful thanks of everybody for all he does in this Parish, for both churchgoers and non-church goers alike.


EAST BRIDGFORD W.I.

Reading through The Chichester Leaflet, the monthly news bulletin of the diocese of Chichester, I came across this gem of an item. Headlined: "Board Christians? (ACCM Cardboard Supplies Ltd)", this tongue in cheek contribution reads:-

"We are writing to inform your readers about our latest product. Following upon the success of our cardboard policemen to deter shoplifters and our cardboard police car to discourage speeding, we are pleased to announce that we have now cardboard clergymen.

Cardboard Vicar: The cardboard vicar is invaluable to the hard-pressed clergyman seeking a holiday who cannot find anyone for relief duty. THIS EFFECTS YOU

In 1974 the National Government got it wrong! Nothing new, you say, but it was the reorganisation of Local Government, I mean. Now 'they' want to get it right and need your help. Parliament has set up a full Commission to look at all Councils (County, District & Borough) in England to see what changes may be necessary to ensure 'value for money'.

By the time you read this the local press and radio announcements will have been made as to the 3 individual Commissioners who will investigate Nottinghamshire - for us here in East Bridgford we are administered by Notts C.C and Rushcliffe B.C. Do we need 2 Councils - the 'two tier' system - to look after our affairs (Education, Police, Libraries, Planning, Refuse Collection etc), or would it be better to have just one Council - the 'unitary' variety. If so, which one? Notts C.C. or Rushcliffe B.C. Or would you rather join with Newark perhaps.

The Commissioners will be available in Notts for Stage 1 of their investigations, from 21 June to 5 Sept, and want to hear from YOU, the man and woman in the street. What sort of local government do YOU want? Two tier: unitary: exactly as now: with minor changes: with major changes: how do you think 'it' can be improved?

After reading your letters or listening to your views, on to stage 2 (Sept - 19 Dec) when the Commissioners will be back in London writing their Report of Options and Recommendations. Followed by stage 3 (Dec 20 - Feb '94) Consultation with us,

by Public Meetings and finally, stage 4 (Feb - 5th June) the Final Report and Submission to the Secretary of State for Environment. Then to Parliament for action.

I am certain we have all moaned about 'them' on the Council (Notts or Rushcliffe) and thought it could be done better, or cheaper. Well now's your chance to have your say and make suggestions for improvement. Such a chance may never come again in our lifetime, so do not waste it. A simple letter, or a telephone call, is all that will be needed. But if YOU do nothing - then don't 'moan' in the future when a 'new' system of Local Government takes effect here in Nottinghamshire. YOU HAVE MEEN WARNED. Your local paper will have the names and addresses to write/telephone to with your views and ideas.

The Summer production of the E.B.D.G from 15th - 19th June was "And a Nightingale Sang", a comedy by C.P.Taylor about the working class Stott family from the Meadows, Nottingham, set against the backdrop of the 1939-45 war. There is no real story, but a series of incidents are portrayed showing how this family coped from the day war was declared to the day when hostilities in Europe ceased.

Although the stage had a minimum of props, yet by the clever use of lighting, different rooms or areas were defined to fit the action.

The story revolves around the parents, George and Peggy Stott played by Jeff Caunt and Kate Thornburrow, the former becoming a Communist and the latter deeply involved with her religion. They had the misfortune to have her father living with them complete with a moggy in a basket. Played by Alan Haydock, he kept shuffling in and out and was not as deaf or as stupid as his family thought.

The Stotts had two daughters, Joyce played by Jackie Harris, who at the start was semi-engaged to a soldier called Eric, played by Geoff Morgan and who later married him. Neither were particularly convincing in their roles. The elder daughter, Helen, played by Jean Starbuck, was in danger of being left on the shelf and so jumped at the opportunity of having a man of her own when Norman, another soldier played by Rob Levis, turned up. Helen was the narrator of the family fortunes (and misfortunes). introducing each episode throughout the play. Jean Starbuck's

performance as Helen was the high point of the evening, her joy at finding a man and her sadness when she found him to be already married with a son, will long be remembered.

Another key performer was pianist, Jim Brennan, who played all the well known songs of the time off stage to the miming of George on stage. Although the synchronisation was not always perfect, the playing itself added much to the atmosphere. What a pity no one thought to include Jim in the curtain call at the end.

The Front of House arrangements and the interval refreshments were handled with their usual efficiency.

As for the play itself, although I had an enjoyable evening, I found some of the episodes not totally convincing - my recollection of air raids is not one of panic! This could, of course, be the fault of the script. It was perhaps an over ambitious play to attempt and with the exception of Jean Starbuck's performance, not quite up the recent high standards of the E.B.D.G.





EAST BRIDGFORD TRAFFIC MATTERS

PROGRESS REPORT

East Bridgford Show on 26 June saw, amongst many other things, the launch of a Village Code of Practice on traffic. This is one aspect of the work that has resulted from the initial public meeting held at the W.I. Hut earlier this year, which nearly 100 people attended.

Speed has proved to be the main recurrent source of concern, and liaison with the Parish and County Councils has, to date, achieved the following results:-

- Agreement to the provision of "Please Drive Carefully" signs on the main village approaches.
- Agreement to the provision of double yellow lines at the Main Street/College Street junction to improve visibility.
- 3) Approval by the County of the Code of Practice.

The County Council are however extremely reluctant to consider more radical measures of "traffic calming" to physically force vehicles to observe the speed limit. Various techniques are now widely used elsewhere across the UK and Europe. Nor will they currently consider moving or reducing the current speed limits.

Negotiations and lobbying will continue, taking advantage of the Governments own campaign against speeding "Kill your speed, not a child". An independent speed survey may be carried out. In the meantime, the Code of Practice may help foster a responsible attitude from residents.

CODE OF PRACTICE

- A. Drive carefully within the village. Kill your speed, not a child.
- B. Respect pedestrians, parents with children, cyclists, disabled people, horses and riders. Give them time and room to react.
- C. Approach junctions with care. Avoid accidents.
- D. Park with care, particularly at the school, shops and surgery. Do not cause a hazard.
- E. Respond to road signs. They are there for a purpose.
- F. Be courteous and give way. Take others into consideration.
- G. Co-operate to protect East Bridgford's environment. It needs your support.

EAST BRIDGFORD POST OFFICE



For the past 34 years the Lodders have been in charge of the Post Office, Ian Lodder for the past 10 years. At the same time, he ran an Electrical Contractors business as this was permitted since he was an Agent of the Post Office and not employed by them. Due to a down turn nationally in the Electrical Contracting business. Mr Lodder decided with regret that he would have to close the business which he did in January 1992. Since he did not wish to remain as a Sub-Postmaster for the rest of his working life, he sought employment elsewhere and in June 1992 was offered a post with the Rural Development Commission. appointment he took up in September 1992. He then put the Post Office and its other activities on the market and at the present time four people have indicated interest to Post Office Counters in providing the Agency service.

There is no truth in the mischievous rumours at present circulating that the Government wishes to close down village Post Offices nor that this Post Office is not a viable business. In fact, allPost Offices are allocated units according to their activity and East Bridgford is seven times greater than the minimum required before a Post Office is considered for closure. The Sub Postmaster is not a salaried employee of the Post Office, but an Agent whose remuneration is proportional to its activity.

For personal reasons Mr Lodder wishes to convert the front portion of his house (at present used by the Post Office) back to residential use and a planning application has been submitted for this change of use. Before the "Franchise" (for this is in effect what it is) can be offered to someone else, it has to be surrendered by the present holder and this was done by giving 3 months notice on 24th May which expires on 24th August. In reply to a letter expressing concern sent by the Parish Council to the Head of Post Office Counters in Nottingham, the Head said that he would do all in his power to maintain a local presence in the village. This is, of course, dependent on a suitable applicant coming forward. Post Office Counters is a business like any other business, and so the fee required from the incoming franchise holder is based on a recognised considered taking into account the viability of the business. We can only hope that by 24th August one of the prospective purchasers will be able to continue the Post Office in East Bridgford, albeit in alternative premises. Meantime I would like to express our thanks to Albert and Ian Lodder for

Show Report

EAST BRIDGFORD FLOWER SHOW

The Annual Flower Show was held on the Reindeer Inn Field on Saturday 26th June under grey skies with a chill wind. Traditionally this starts with a Fancy Dress Parade led by a band, this year the Chesterfield Musketeers, and goes down the village from Brickyard Lane to the show field. But what a disappointing Fancy turn out ofparticipants! Not until we reached the school and were joined by the Playgroup children did the numbers swell. Why the poor turnout? Was it because there was no theme this year? (Last year it was Robin Hood). Around the show ground were many stall holders displaying their goods. together with a Bouncing Castle, Face Painting. Coconut Shy and other side shows. In the arena during the afternoon were displays of Dressage put on by Sue Taylor, Maypole Dancing by the 2nd East Bridgford Brownies, and the Rodney School Dancers from Kirklington.

One of the disappointments was the display by the Sealed Knot Society. Originally it was hoped that their Foot Soldiers would have come, but due to their other commitments they sent their Artillery and four Musketeers. There was no commentary to tell us about them and their actions, but instead we had to endure for half an hour their cannon and four muskets being fired which deafened the bystanders and upset many children. If they take so long to load and fire, no wonder they had to have a Hundred Years War!!

The Tug-of-War, refereed in his usual efficient way by Dr Stuart Fraser, was won by R.A.F Newton who, if I remember rightly, won it last year. The President, Mr Terry Bradley, distributed the Cups and Trophies, once again Brian Crossland beating a well worn track to the table to receive his many awards.

As to the main object of the show, namely the exhibiting of flowers, plants, and vegetables, and the Homecraft sections, while the quality of the exhibits was high, the number of entries was disappointing although there was an increase in the number of entries in section 3 which was encouraging. In some classes there were no entries at all! I am in no way criticising the Secretary and all his hard working committee when I say that some serious thinking will have to be done if the show is to survive. The attendance of about 1.500 was down, the number of entries was down and it looks as if a financial loss will again be incurred as it was in the three previous years. (Only Governments can continue to spend more than thev receive).

This is YOUR VILLAGE SHOW, so don't let it collapse by default. What do YOU think are the reasons? Other competing activities prior to or on the same day? A general lack of interest in old traditions? Lack of time or falling interest in producing exhibits for showing? What do similar shows in other parts of the country put on as attractions? I do not pretend to know the answers, but am trying to stimulate discussion before it is too late!!

I am sure that the Chairman, Secretary and Committee Members would be delighted to receive your constructive suggestions and comments before or at the Annual General Meeting which is being held at 7.30pm in the W.I.Hut on FRIDAY 3RD SEPTEMBER (not on Friday 10th September as shown in the Show Programme)





HARVEST THANKSGIVING "LET THE EARTH BE GLAD"

The message of the Bible is plain: The Earth is the Creation of the Lord God and the Lord made it for us. He has given it to us; to our human race; yet capable of wonderful acts of love and compassion as well as terrible deeds of darkness and hate.

God gave us the World to use; to love; to care for; to treasure. How easily we forget what a wonderful treasure it is. We should think carefully what we do to the World we have been given; to keep this treasure in right order, safe and protected, living and growing.

OCTOBER 4TH. is the feast day of St.Francis of Assisi, a remarkable character who lived in Italy. 1182 - 1226. He grew up as a fashionable young man - about town, but sickness and becoming a prisoner of war changed his outlook on life. He decided to give away all he had and devote his life to serving other people and God, after the example of Jesus. Many men and women were caught up with his example and formed themselves into a monastic order, the Franciscans, living a very simple life of poverty and love for others, however poor or sick or downtrodden.

It has been a privilege to meet George and to follow his development in the ministry. We hope that he will be able to use his many talents and his training in the service of the Anglican Church in Ghana, supported by his wife and family, and the prayers of those who have come to know them.

PADDLING POOLS AND FRYING PANS

Paddling pools, frying pans, guitars and cardboard box boats are just some of the items we have used in our monthly Family Services on the third Sunday of each month at 10.45. We aim to make worship more relevant to children in the 2 to 11 age group by involving them in drama, music-making, crafts and discussion, so that learning and worship are not just passive things we do by sitting in a pew. Prayer does not necessarily mean kneeling down with your eyes squeezed tightly shut, but, as we did on Sea sunday, it may mean looking at lighted candles floating on the water in the paddling pool, as we prayed for seafarers and thought of the dangers they meet. Worship is not just singing hymns to organ music, but is sometimes led by children playing piano, guitars instruments and may be choruses with actions, clapping or percussion. And learning about God is not just listening to a talk or sermon, but may be more effective if you are involved in movement, cookery (thats where the frying pans came in) making something or sharing ideas.

If you feel that this less formal style of worship would suit your family, do come along and join in on September 19th and the 3rd Sunday of each month. The service usually lasts about 35 minutes so is not too long for the youngest children (and no-one minds if they make a noise or can't sit still for very long)

We Are Survivors

For all those born before 1940, we celebrate today because we are here! Consider the changes we have witnessed.

We were born before the TV age, before polio shots, frozen food, plastics, contact lenses, frisbees and the pill.

We were before refrigerators, dishwashers, tumble dryers, electric blankets, air conditioners, credit cards, split atoms, laser beams, ballpoint pens and before man walked on the moon. We got married first and then lived together. How quaint can you be!

In our time closets were for clothes, not for coming out of. Bunnies were small rabbits and dishes were for washing and not receiving programmes from outer space. Designer Jeans were scheming girls and having a meaningful relationship meant getting along well with your cousins. We thought fast food was what you ate during Lent and cold turkey was what you ate on Boxing Day.

We were before 'house-husbands', gay rights, computer dating, dual careers and commuter marriage. Divorce was something that happened to film stars. We were before day-care centres, group therapy and nursing homes. We played with Dinky toys, wore liberty-bodices and took a daily dose of cod liver oil and malt. We drank Ovaltine, ate porridge and listened to Dick Barton, the Goon Show, Workers' Playtime and Housewives' Choice.

We had never heard of Radio 1, tape decks, electric typewriters, artificial hearts, word processors or yoghurt. For us time-sharing meant togetherness, not Spanish holiday homes. A chip meant a piece of wood, hardware meant a shop where you bought hammers and nails, and software was not even a word.

In 1940 'Made in Japan' meant poor quality, and the Koreans and Taiwanese had not even started production. Pizzas, McDonalds and instant coffee were unheard of. We were born when everything in Woolworths cost one penny. For sixpence you could take a tram ride, go to the cinema and buy an ice cream.

In our day cigarette smoking was fashionable, grass was mowed, coke was for burning and pot was something you cooked in. Rock music was a lullaby and AIDS were for those with hearing difficulties.

We were certainly not before the difference between the sexes was discovered, but we were surely before the sex change, we made do with what we had and we were the last generation to think you needed a husband to have a baby!

We typed letters with manual typewriters, did computations by hand and used carbon paper to make copies. We used telephones without buttons and Fax was something you looked up in an encyclopedia.

We did business with handshakes and trust and somehow it all worked and we survived.



Recently our Parochial Church Council has been considering ways in which we might all encourage more the children and young people, who are linked with our Church. Helpful suggestions were also made at the Annual Parochial Meeting in response to Dr Hilary Geisow's address on the CHILDREN'S CHARTER.

Some years ago I came across statistics, which were kept between the first and second World Wars. In the Church of England, of children sent to Sunday School only 2.5 per cent stayed and became active adult members, whereas of children brought to Church with their parents 69 per cent stayed. What I found significant was that statistics produced by the brethren Churches were almost identical. CONCLUSION? Families should worship together.

More and more, as we learn to be the church of the nineties, firstly we should endeavour to bring generations together. This does not mean an end to activities with people our own age, but it does mean that children should be involved even more in Sunday Worship: reading. leading our intercessions, serving at the altar, playing musical instruments, helping prepare the Church for the Sung Eucharist and Evensong, assisting at Baptisms and Weddings. Secondly, I commend to the whole congregation the Family Eucharist, 9am on the first Sunday each month and the Family Service, 10.45am, on the third Sunday each month. If our children and young people are involved in these services, they should be encouraged and

supported by the older members of the Church or we have no right to expect the younger people to attend the more traditional services in our church.

CHILDREN IN DISTRESS

Aiding the Children of Eastern Europe

The fighting in Bosnia and Croatia continues, children continue to die of Aids in Romania and in Albania children are suffering from diseases such as pneumonia, hepatitis, T.B. congenital heart conditions and many infectious diseases which we have almost forgotten about.

+++++++++++++++

At present little can be done for the children of Bosnia and Croatia due to the intense fighting there, equipment, finance and supplies have to be kept in readiness for the time when shooting stops and work and restoration can begin for the war-torn children of Bosnia and Croatia.

++++++++++++++++

St. Laurence Children's Hospice in Cernavoda, Romania has now been open for 18 months and provides a home and lifeline for up to 100 children. It is staffed by volunteer British Doctors, Nurses and Carers together with Romanian Staff. The Hospice is in an area with the biggest outbreak of childhood Aids anywhere in Europe. The children there are very well cared for and loved, though most of them will not get better. Many people visiting the Hospice have been overwhelmed by the care and love given to these children and the feeling of hope and optimism that pervades the Hospice. One British G.P. returning from St. Laurence's wrote, "I have never come back from a fortnight's leave from the surgery feeling so uplifted — I was given far more than I was able to give."

+++++++++++++++

St. Luke's Children's Hospice and Hospital in Albania is currently under construction and is due to open in 1994. It will cost £500,000 to build and will then need to be equipped. Albania is a very poor country where young and old live and die in extreme poverty, many children beg in the atreets, there is no industry to speak of - a really poor country. They do not have the Aids problem in their children that Romania has but lack most basic drugs, dressings, antibiotics which could save so many childrens lives.



THE RECTOR'S **PAGES**

MUTED JOY

The past five or six weeks have been fraught with much sadness as we have shared the bereavement of several families from within our village and We continue in church congregration. sympathies and deep concern for them. and the welcoming of the New Year will never be

quite the same again.

To be plunged suddenly from happiness into misery is no uncommon experience, but it always imposes Sufferers may an uncommon strain on faith. despair and follow the advice of Job's wife to 'curse God and die', or they may stand up against misfortune in more than one way. A noble and austere way is that of the stoic who, by an effort of will, strives to keep a serene mind, unmoved by hope or fear. Pride, a pride which commands our respect, keeps the stoical humanist erect in life's storms.

The Christian way, however, puts no strain on human self as it actually exists. It's gospel for the sufferer nearing despair is not that he has only to "pull himself together" to meet adversity, but rather that, left to himself, he can do nothing of the kind. His only hope is that he can stretch out to the Power, not himself, which can carry him through.

of strength in the Christian source understanding of life is the Redeemer who has known all the griefs of human existence and invites his followers to cast all their cares on him. Looking at the wondrous cross of Christ, the believer sees One, who was tortured to death, who was betraved by a friend, was execrated by his fellow men and cast out; One, moreover, who endured the experience of being cut off from God. We do not have to explain our agonies to Christ. He shares them.

All this we can say to others, when they despair, and to ourselves too. And how often has the saving

power of this life line been proved!

St. Paul says that we are to rejoice, even in times of tribulation. This is a large claim. We should hardly dare to hint to anyone crushed by unexpected calamity or the treachery of friends to go singing through life. Enough, we think that they should have courage and take up the business of living again. But some, who have passed this way with more perseverance than most, reported that they can also rejoice, because they have been able to offer their suffering to God, in union with Christ, to be part of his sacrifice by which he redeemed the world. If we put our hand into the hand of God we shall be given his strength to approach the coming year. May it bring confidence and peace for us all.

East Bridgford Cricket Club

Report on 1993 Season

For the first time since 1984, East Bridgford Cricket Club has achieved success in a major competition. They are Champions of Division 3 of the Home Brewery Village League after winning 13 games, 11 of them consecutively, and a winning margin of 17 points. The 2nd XI also had a good season winning 10 of their games and finishing 5th, a few more bonus points would have seen move them to 3rd and a possibility of promotion. We even won a trophy in the village quiz, brains as well as brawn!

Of the 26 people that played for the 1st XI, 9 averaged over 20 runs per innings. The top batman was Peter Smith, who scored 407 runs including 5 50's, and averaged 37. Close on his tail was Jake Warren, in his 9 games he scored 313 runs average 35 and 3 50's. Graham Hobbs, Mark Wilson, and Neil Foster all scored over 220 runs and averaged above 25, pointing to the great strength in our batting.

The bowling honours were also spread around the team, pride of place going to off spinner Stuart Whaley, 24 wickets at 12 each, followed closely by make shift skipper Glenn Willis (19 at 14 each). 16 year old Chris Hindson forays into the 1st team were well rewarded with 13 wickets at 15 apiece. The other main bowlers are lead by Graham Hobbs, Malcolm Porter, and a rejuvenated Neil Foster who with Graham proved to be our most consistent all rounder.

The most frustrated player in the team award goes to elected skipper Richard Bullock, who in the 6 games he played, 4 were lost, he took 17 wickets, and then broke a finger in a Cope Cup game, and didn't play again.

The great event of the season was the staging of the Derek Randall testimonial game early in June. With nearly the full Notts side turning out losing by 2 runs was a great result, as was the good size crowd that turned up on what proved to be a glorious evening.

We wish to thank all those people that turned up to watch, and especially to those who contributed to the Match Programme.

As with the 1st XI, the 2nd XI batsmen proved to be the match winners. Solid opening partnerships between Scott Brownson and 16 year old David Andrews, son of the skipper Dave Andrews, formed the basis of many of their wins, good back up by Phil Kirby and old stalwarts Mike Spurr, Bill Woolrich and John Atkin, proved to much for most opposition.

The bulk of the bowling was again done by Richard Miles, with good back up from Mike Spurr, John Atkin. The younger bowlers Nick Smith, Sam Oliver, Chris Hindson, and David Andrews all gain good experience, and produced some good analysts. The most improved bowler was Keith Lawrence who gain in confidence as the season progress, he proved very economical and a good wicket taker including one haul of 7 wickets.

The Sunday side has been the disappointment of the year struggling against relegation for all of the season needing to win the last 2 game to have any chance of survival.

Here again an injury to the skipper Stuart Johnson, this time before the season started, added to the problem of getting a settled side, and left them without a consistent run scorer.

The Sunday side suffers from players unwilling to commit to playing twice at the weekend. Only 2 of the 1st XI were regularly available, others played from time to time, resulting in an un-settled side, compounded by the lack of a regular skipper.

Some good batting performance were recorded by Bruce Willis, Peter Salter, Dan Blagg, and Dave Bell, back after 8 years in South Africa.

The bowling was probably an area that caused the most concern, especially in the early part of the season when the younger bowlers were used as the strike bowlers, against some very good batting sides. Later with the arrival of Kevin Hindson, Neil Foster, and Stuart Whaley things improved. After losing the first 8 games every game became a relegation battle.

The great improvement in the fortunes of the club are a combination of the money spent on improving the wicket, shown by the much better batting performances, the artificial wicket which has doubled as nets, and the introduction of younger players.

This year we entered 3 youth competitions, NCA U-14's, Trent Valley U-15's, and the Notts Evening U-17's. There were no trophies this year but some encouraging performances, especially from the U-17's, who beat Plumtree, amongst others, and could have beaten Players and Notts Unity, all senior clubs.

With the majority of the side now playing regularly for the Saturday and Sunday sides, and available to play, we could do better next year.

The U-15's League was a complete administrative disaster this year with sides dropping out, unable to field sides, there were more games cancelled then were played, with no sides completing all their fixtures. On the bright side Ben Lee batted well and carned a right to play in the 2nd XI.

The U-14's struggled this season, but there were some good performances from Fergus Appleton, James Miles, both from Cropwell Butler, James Pearce, Gavin White, Tom Rippon, Tom Phillison and Alex Porter. We also were helped by Andy Coe and Mark Hackett from Bingham who provided some match winning performances.

In conclusion we wish to thank all the people that are involved in providing cricket for us, repecially are groundsmen Ged Willis and Keith Hackett, and of course are Tea Ladies, with special thanks to Marion Willis, and Chris Porter.

We are rapidly approaching the flu season. Here are a few guidelines :

What Is Flu?

Flu is a viral infection which can make even the fittest person feel quite ill.

Symptoms

High Temperature - Headache - Aching Limbs - Weak Muscles - Dry Irritating Cough - Sore Throat - Runny, Itchy Nose

Who Can Catch Flu?

ANYONE! Flu can spread very rapidly so it is easy to catch and pass on to others. Flu is most likely to affect you in the Autumn and Winter e.g. from October to March. Some people are more at risk than others.

Who Is More At Risk?

If you are OVER 65. If you have a HEART, LUNG or KIDNEY disorder or have DIABETES or ASTHMA.

How Can I Protect Myself?

If you are one of those patients who are at greater risk from flu, you should try to avoid catching it! A flu vaccination can help to protect you from flu. One simple injection, given in the Autumn, can help to protect you right through the cold months when flu is most prevalent.

The flu vaccine will be available in the Surgery from the 11th October 1993. Please make an appointment to see your Practice Sister. Please tell reception when you make your appointment that it is for a flu vaccination as there will be extra sessions available especially for flu vaccinations.

What To Do If You Have Flu

- Go to bed.
- Drink plenty of fluids.
- Take Paracetamol or Aspirin to help relieve symptoms.
- Use a hot water bottle if you feel shivery.
- Call your doctor for advice if symptoms persist for more than a few days.

THE RECTOR'S PAGES

ARMISTICE DAY

This year we commemorate the 75th ANNIVERSARY OF ARMISTICE DAY, 1918.

The history of our village relates how life was affected greatly by the wars in the early part of the 20th Century. The Boer War in South Africa, 1899-1902 left its memories. Herbert Milward was mentioned in despatches by Lord Kitchener and the following year he, together with Pte H.Chapman and George Higgs were welcomed home on their safe return. Sixteen years later, in the Great War, Herbert Milward, then Lieut Col, received the D.S.O.

Arthur du Boulay Hill recalls that, when peace was signed 31st May 1902, a Thanksgiving Service was held at St.Peter's, and a new white ensign was hoisted on the tower, the restoration of which had just been completed. Hitherto, access to the top of the tower had been only possible by a ladder raised outside.

The final part of the Church's restoration, which had lasted over fifteen years, was completed just before the beginning of the Great War. In August 1914 war was declared. In November several refugees from Antwerp made their home here. Lists published in the parish magazine contained the names of 130 who served in the Navy and Army from this parish. Nottingham was bombed in 1916.

Nearly two years following the Armistice, 11th November, 1918, on Sunday the 27th June 1920, the Memorial Cross, overlooking the cross-roads of our village was dedicated to the memory of the twenty-two men, who fell in the war. The inscription cut on the two upper steps reads:

TO THE MEMORY OF THE FALLEN IN THE GREAT WAR 1914 - 1918

THEIR NAME LIVETH FOR EVERMORE
Twenty five years later, a bronze tablet was added in memory of those who gave their lives in the second war 1939 - 45.

Our Annual Remembrance Sunday Service takes place at 10.50am on 14th November, when we shall keep faith with the resolve of seventy five years ago, that their name shall live for ever more. I know that for all present there will be a very special significance.

The Old Toll Bridge, East Bridgford

Perhaps some readers have noticed the transformation of the Old Toll Bridge rampart on the village side of the Trent? If not, have a look when you are next out walking in Trent Lane. Rushcliffe, who have carried out the work, have now provided East Bridgford with a feature of interest and a link with the past. Some money to assist with the project was kindly donated by Dorothy Millichamp. Her father used the Old Toll Bridge, when it spanned the Trent, to cross to meet his sweetheart. Have a look at the small dedication to the couple in the corner of the interpretation board.

Some further work is planned between the road and the bridge, but long term, the parish and its people will have to look after the site, to keep it as an attractive place to watch the birds and boats passing on the Trent. The rough land to the right of the bridge itself narrowly missed being registered as common land. It is now owned by the Diocese of Southwell, but usually sees few visitors apart from anglers and flotsam from the periodic flooding of the river. This site too could be managed to provide a mixture of scrub, willow trees and open grass. Some years ago when these ideas were first raised, it proved difficult to identify village folk who would take an active interest in the site. Now that the Old Toll Bridge has been made into a feature of interest, perhaps there are village folk who would like to help enhance the area for the pleasure of all who visit, ramble or fish beside the Trent. 



THE RECTOR'S CHRISTMAS MESSAGE

What child is this, who, laid to rest On Mary's lap is sleeping? Whom angels greet with anthems sweet, While shepherds watch are keeping?

What then is this child, who can inspire so many to imperil their lives for His Sake; who can instill such faith that, no matter how cruel and oppressive an evil regime, it can never be completely stamped out?

This, this is Christ the King; Whom shepherds guard and angels sing, Haste, haste, to bring him land The Babe, the Son of Mary.



Dear Residents/Villagers

Since the open meeting at the W.I.Hut last February, which was attended by so many of you, a small committee (12 members) has been formed and has met on a regular basis to discuss all the issues raised.

The group has been studying in particular the problems of SPEEDING and PARKING within the village. We have sought assistance in conjunction with the Parish Council, and have approached the Notts County Council and the Police. Surveys have been conducted both on the traffic flow and speeding, along Main Street and Kneeton Road. New signs have been placed on Kirk Hill and Main Street entrances to the village and these are awaiting the addition of 'Please drive carefully through our village' signs. Also under negotiation are Yellow lines to control parking around the College Street junction and the possibilities of a crossing at the Surgery end of the Main Street.


An area under constant attention is the A46 junction and the problems and hazards created in crossing it both now and later when the new dual carriage is built. Should you wish to lobby any opinions you may have, we have the full details of whomto contact.

The Group has also researched traffic calming schemes developed locally and is currently working on our own possible proposals with several members of the Parish Council.
